



19th century Chinese snuff-box in gold, agate and enamel.

Tobacco bottle in the shape of a drop topped by a gold and green enamel stopper set with cultured pearls and finished with a jade cap. A braided cord surrounds the cap. The body of the piece is made of a lined agate stone. The outer part of the agate is white in colour and reveale the amber background of the piece and highlighting the four-petal flower sculptures. A gold stopper ends in a spatula. These objects were created to replace the European snuffbox, which was too wide and favoured the oxidation of tobacco.

Numerous collectors such as E.Guimet or A.Baur have a passion for these elegant tobacco objects.
