



19th century silver and cut-crystal confiturier with 12 spoons, Restauration Period

Era: 1st part of the 19th century.

Materials: silver, crystal.

Dim: H 10,23 in (26 cm) / W 9.44 in. (24 cm).

Weight: 55.16 oz (1564 g).

Confiturier hallmark:

Head of Cérès (1819-1838).

Head of Old man (1819-1838).

Giraffe head (1835-1838).

Spoons hallmark:

Head of Old man (1819-1838).

Meduse mark.

Silver and cut-crystal confiturier in Medici-shape decorated with two handles with floral motifs and volutes end in a swan's head. The silver frame is adorned with laurel leaves and stylized palmettes. The confiturier dish rests on a raised foot adorned with four leaning dolphins placed on a finely chiseled square base with a floral frieze. Four feet with foliage motifs support the set. The removable lid is topped with a flower. Twelve vermeil spoons are organized around the confiturier bowl and are held by a silver display.

Silversmith for the confiturier: **Pierre Auguste Courtois** (1819-1838).

Silversmith for the spoons: **Charles Josse Walgrave** (1819-1838).
