



Late 18th century red porphyry centrepiece with cherubs in patinated bronze

Era: Late 18th century-Early 19th century

Materials: porphyry, ormolu

Dim: H 26.6 in/ Diam 16.5 in

Dim: H 67,5 cm/ Diam 42 cm

An imposing bowl made of red Egyptian porphyry with mouldings and gadroons, supported by three children fishing for shells in patinated bronze. One of them is sitting on a dolphin and blowing a conch shell. The lively base is strewn with shells and reeds. The group rests on a circular base, also in porphyry, encircled by pearls and laurel leaves in gilded bronze.

Late 18th century to early 19th century.
